

ORCID Requirement

The Brazilian Journal of Cardiovascular Surgery (BJCVS) notifies that from May 2018 it will be mandatory for authors submitting manuscripts to fill in the ORCID ID field in the article registry.

The ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID) is free, non-profit, and not associated to any publisher. It's part of a wider digital infrastructure required for researchers and its goal is to provide a unique, persistent international digital identifier that distinguishes one researcher from another, allowing transparent and reliable connections between their contributions and affiliations.

The ORCID Registry solves problems of ambiguity, preventing confusion between homonyms, erroneous attribution of authorship, or the non-association between the author and his/her name when it is written in different forms (in full, abbreviated, "professional name", etc.).

ORCID also ensures integration into the flow of scientific activities, because it collaborates with other international systems, such as Crossref (DOI), Web of Science (Researcher ID), and Scopus, and financing agencies like FAPESP, CNPq, NIH, etc. It guarantees that your work is automatically updated and recognized throughout the world by collaborating with other identifiers (Researcher ID, Scopus ID, Crossref DOI, etc.).
